



94% of Africans live in countries where governance has improved since the year 2000

The Ibrahim Index of African Governance provides an annual assessment of governance performance by measuring i) Safety & Rule of Law ii) Participation & Human Rights ii) Sustainable Economic Opportunity and iv) Human Development. The African average has been increasing since 2008.

Mauritius was Africa's top-performing country with a score of nearly 83. The most improved countries since 2000 are: Liberia (+24.8), Angola (+18.1), Sierra Leone (+14.8), Rwanda (+10.9) and Burundi (+8.8).
