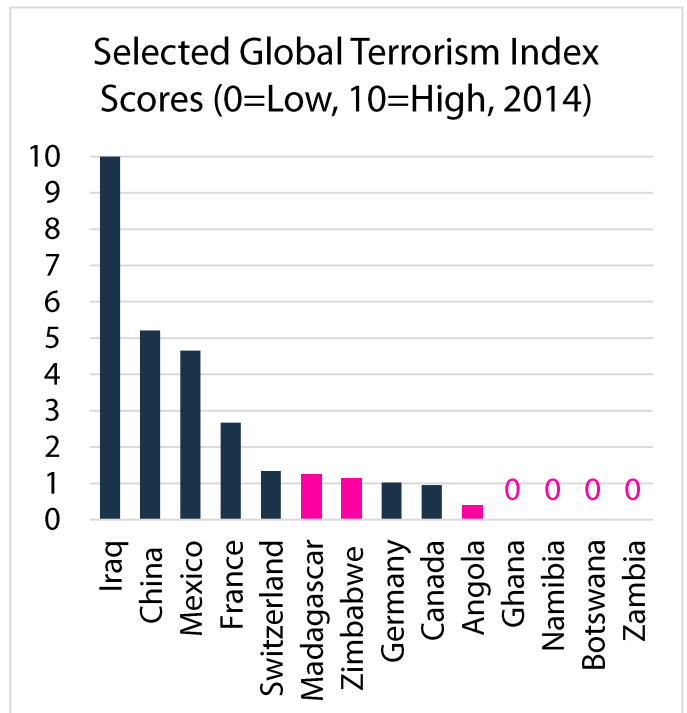


Investors are 5x more likely to be affected by terrorism if they invest in China than if they invest in Ghana

The Global Terrorism Index (GTI) ranks 162 countries by measuring the impact of terrorism on a country (scores: 0 = low, 10 = high). According to the 2014 GTI, among the top 50 countries least affected by terrorism in 2013, 16 (32%) are African and include Zambia, Ghana, Botswana and Namibia all tied in first place with scores of 0. Ghana and Angola for instance are less impacted by terrorism than Sweden (1.07) or Switzerland (1.34). Based on this data, investors are 5 times more likely to be affected by terrorism if they invest in China than if they invested in Ghana.



The Global Peace Index (GPI) measures levels of peace in 162 countries under three themes: the level of safety and security in society, the extent of domestic and international conflict and the degree of militarization. The 2015 GPI finds that Mauritius, Botswana and Namibia are Africa’s 3 most peaceful nations respectively and beat China and Russia. Mauritius (2.03), Senegal (2.08) and Botswana (2.1) lead Africa in societal safety and security and outperform Italy (2.23), United States (2.23) and India (2.63) among other western and Asian countries.
